

The Tobacco Stats: Rural Communities Edition

Adults that live in **rural areas smoke** at a rate of **19.0%** compared to **11.4%** among adults that live in **urban areas.**

America's rural population is **more likely to use tobacco especially smokeless tobacco** and is more heavily impacted by tobacco use.

Rural Americans are also more likely to be exposed to secondhand smoke and less likely to have access to programs that help them quit smoking.

According to CDC data, people living in rural communities have 18 to 20 percent higher rates of lung cancer than people living in urban areas.
