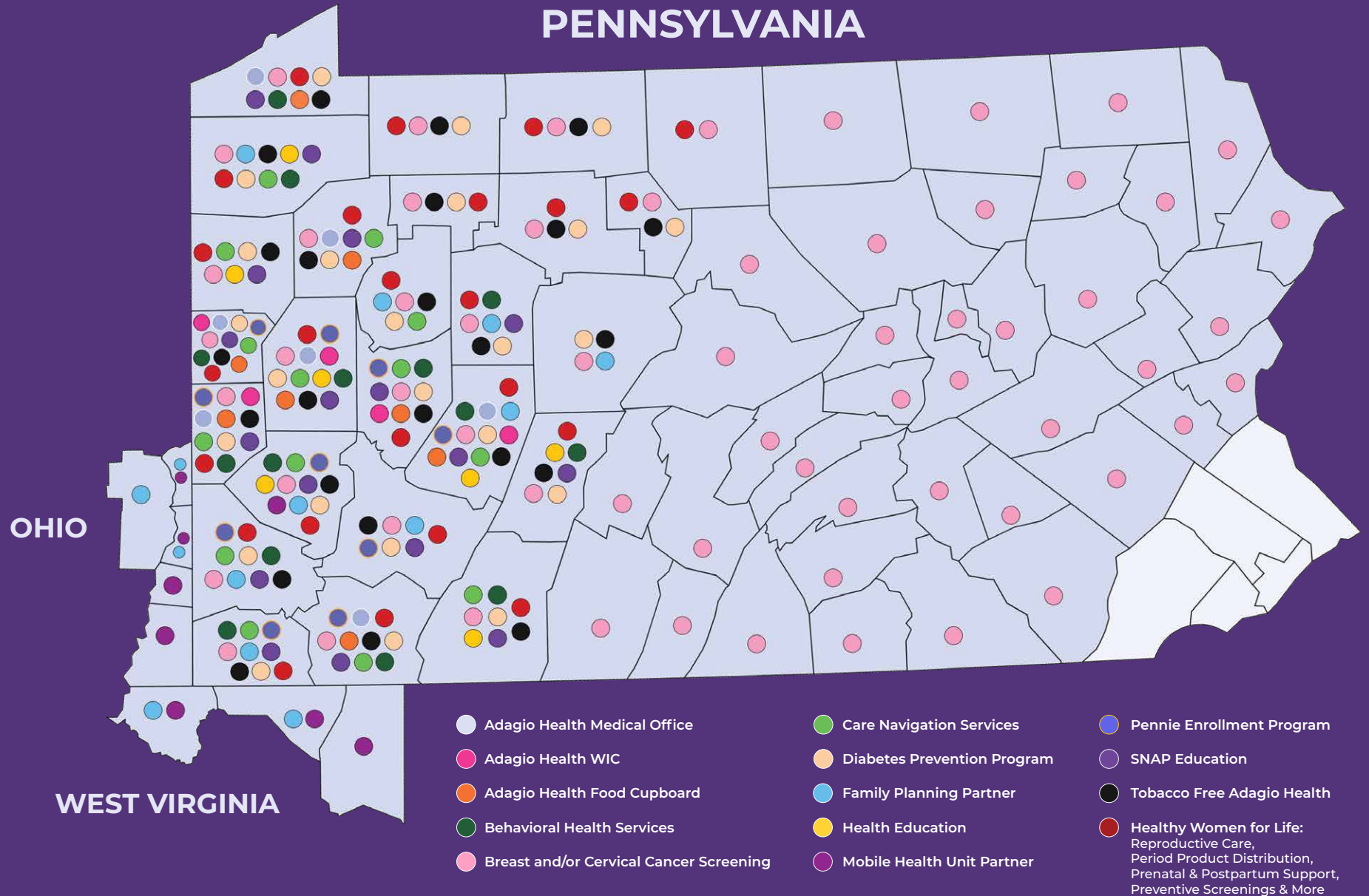

# About Adagio Health

For over 50 years, Adagio Health has been providing health, wellness, and nutrition services and support to residents of Western Pennsylvania. Today, the organization serves approximately 120,000 patients and clients annually. While women's health is a primary focus for the organization; reproductive health and preventive care services are also offered to men, teens, and other patients in need of care in a safe, welcoming setting.

Many of the services offered or overseen by Adagio Health are available at no cost to patients who qualify, and most insurance, including Medicaid, is accepted. Adagio Health operates 7 medical offices in Western PA that also address social determinants of health such as food insecurity, behavioral health, and care navigation, and manages health care partner networks that expand across PA and into West Virginia.

Adagio Health also manages the Women, Infants and Children (WIC) program in 5 PA counties; the Power Up program (a SNAP-Education program) across Western PA; provides tobacco and vaping cessation counseling, support and education to adults and teens; and oversees the Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program, Breast and Cervical Cancer Prevention and Treatment Program and the Mammogram Voucher Program across PA.

Finally, Adagio Health seeks to empower local communities to address nutritional health, diabetes prevention, reproductive health, positive relationship building, and the cultivation of healthy life skills through educational programming. Adagio Health's funding comes from a variety of sources including federal and state programs, foundation grants, corporate support, and individual donations.

# 2025 Year in Review

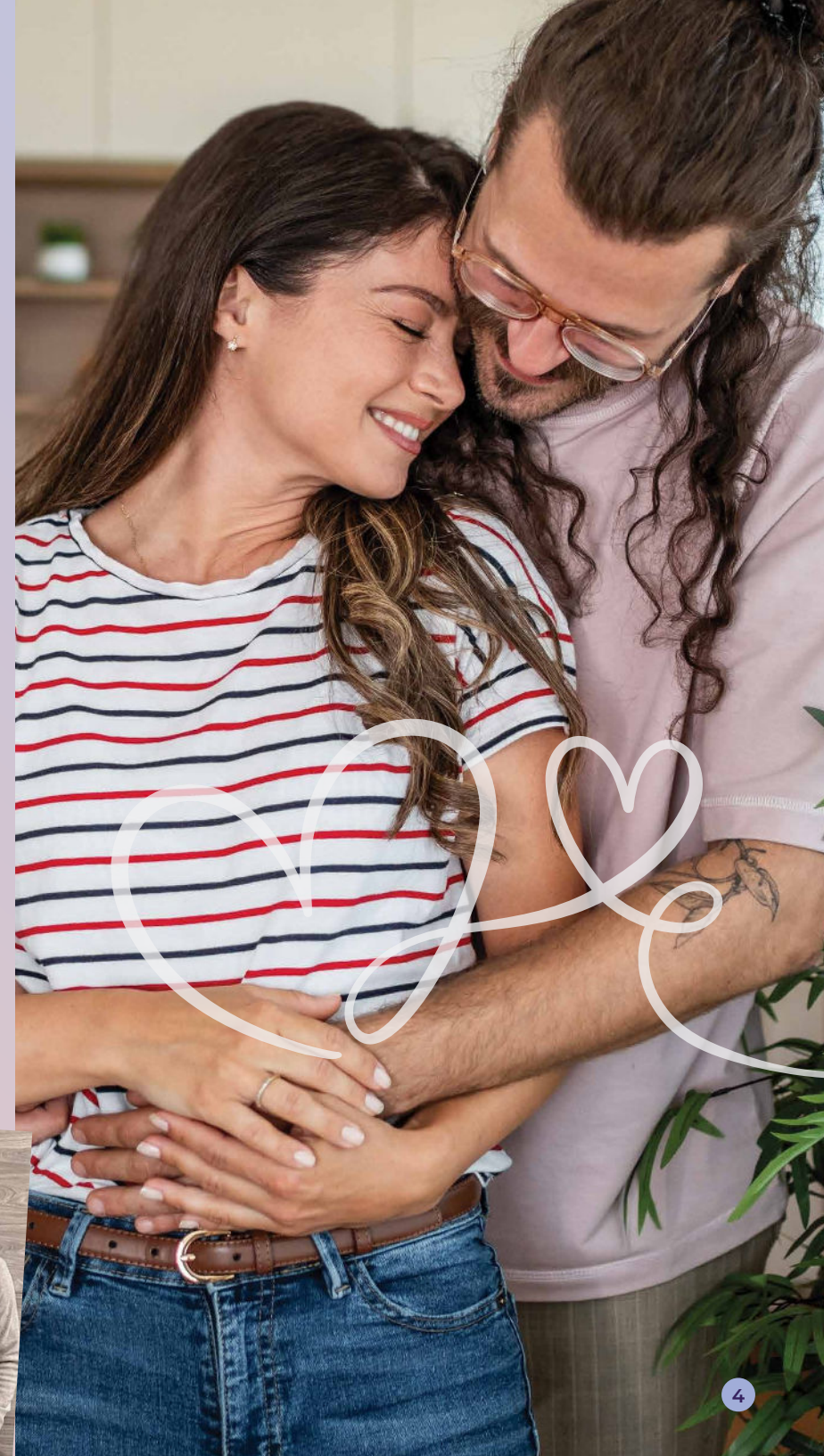
## Family Planning Program

In 2025, Adagio Health's Family Planning department delivered essential care to thousands of individuals across Western Pennsylvania and Northern West Virginia. In calendar year 2025, the network served more than 36,000 women and men in Western Pennsylvania and over 3,000 individuals in Northern West Virginia. Nearly 50% of clients served were low-income, living at or below the Federal Poverty Level, underscoring Adagio Health's commitment to ensuring access to essential health care for communities in need.

During the year, the Family Planning program navigated a three-month period in which federal Title X funding was withheld. Despite this challenge, all partners remained in the network, and services continued uninterrupted throughout the region, reflecting the strength and resilience of Adagio Health and its family planning partners.

Adagio Health's Youth Advisory Council continued to play a vital role in shaping services and messaging for adolescents, helping select topics for marketing campaigns and providing recommendations to enhance the Care for Teens page on the website. The organization also acknowledges the valuable guidance of the Pennsylvania and West Virginia Family Planning Advisory Council and the Information & Education Committee, whose input supports the growth and expansion of family planning programs across both regions.

A key highlight for 2025 was the recognition of Dr. Linda Snyder, Vice President of Family Planning Programs, as the Pennsylvania State Rural Health Leader of the Year, honoring her leadership and commitment to advancing family planning services in rural communities.

### Healthy Women for Life

In 2025, Adagio Health's Healthy Women for Life (HWFL) project, part of Pennsylvania's Women's Services Program, delivered critical health care and support to women across the region, including:

- 15,000+ women served
- 28,000+ total visits
- No-cost reproductive health care services
- Chronic disease screenings, including rapid A1C, glucose, and lipid panel tests
- 7,600+ women receiving free menstrual hygiene supplies
- 309 women provided no-cost blood pressure cuffs for at-home monitoring
- 9,900+ women screened for alcohol and drug concerns
- 1,300+ women supported by the Care Navigation team, connecting them to health care and community resources

### Clinical Operations & Integrated Services

In 2025, Adagio Health enhanced patient experience and operational efficiency with the launch of Intellichart, a new patient portal. By July, more than 70% of patients were enrolled, enabling the organization to expand visit capacity and better accommodate walk-in care. The platform streamlined operations through digital check-in, paperless registration, virtual visits, automated billing with real-time balances, and improved patient access and control over medical records.

Adagio Health also strengthened clinical partnerships to expand services and improve outcomes.

Collaboration with UPMC Horizons and Dr. Noticewala ensured continuity of the prenatal program in New Caste and Hopewell, bringing high-risk prenatal care closer to home. In addition, a partnership with the University of Pittsburgh Infectious Disease Department and Dr. Ho designated Adagio Health as a vetted referral site for regional HIV patients, reducing unnecessary travel to city-based clinics.

During the year, Adagio Health conducted 23,130 visits for 10,642 unique patients, including 1,328 prenatal visits for 131 patients and 2,677 telehealth visits. The no-show rate decreased to 15%, and the patient portal grew to 8,733 users. Translation services provided through Propio supported 500 encounters in 12 languages. Clinical highlights included treatment for 10 Hepatitis C patients, 20 HIV patients, and management of 311 PrEP patients, including 25 new enrollees.

To support this growth and ensure continued access to high-quality care, Adagio Health hired and trained 23 new employees, expanding capacity across clinical, behavioral health, and nutrition services.

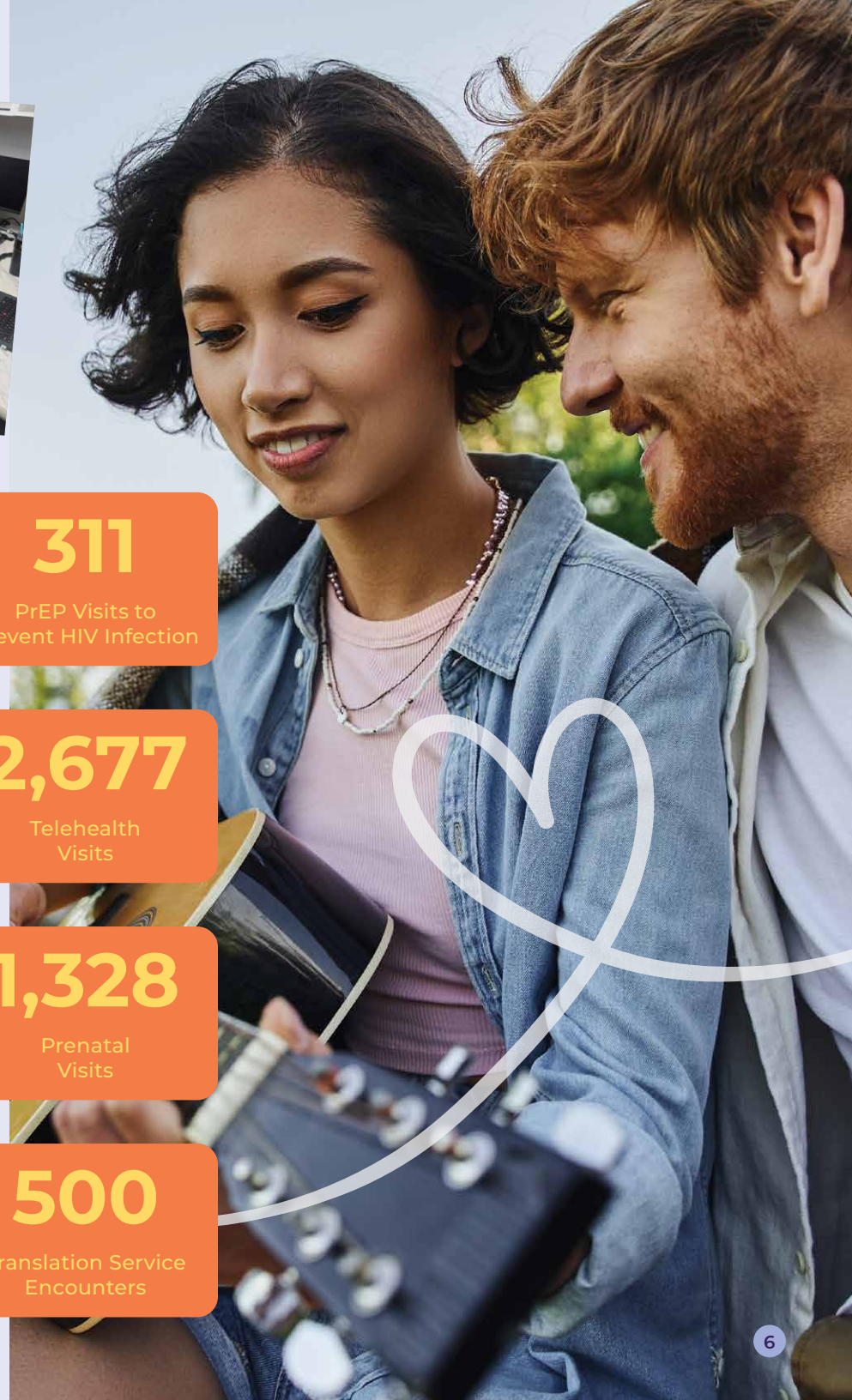

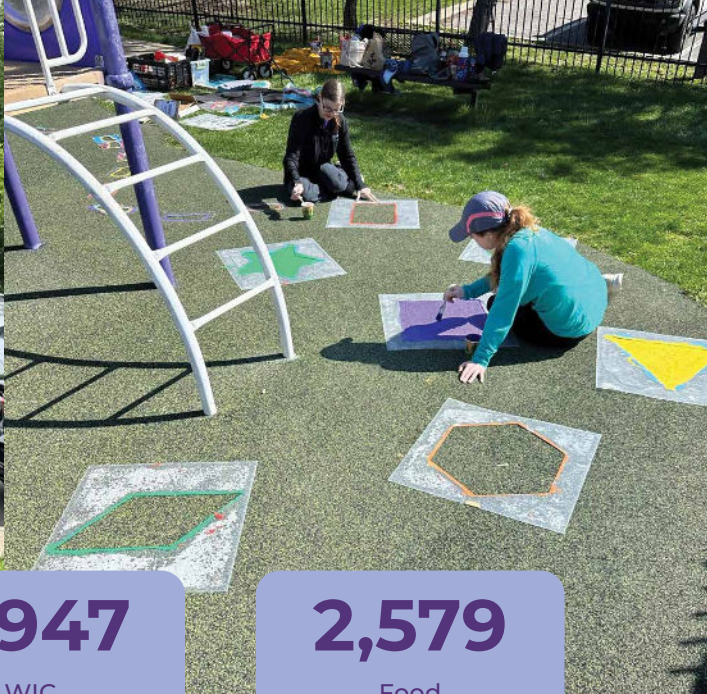
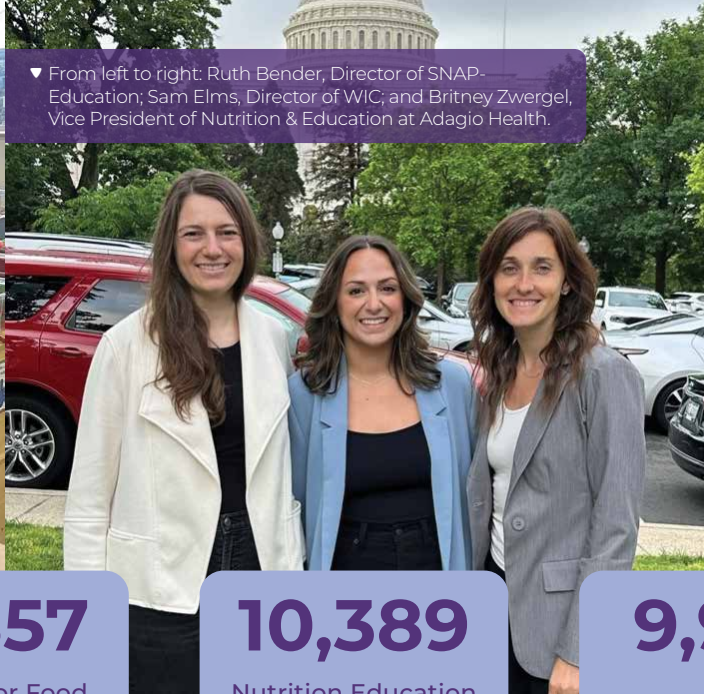

## Nutrition & Education

Adagio Health's Women, Infants & Children (WIC) program supported 9,947 participants, providing vital nutrition services to women, infants, and children across Armstrong, Beaver, Butler, Indiana, and Lawrence counties. The WIC on Wheels van continued to expand access for families in rural communities, serving 170 participants through site visits and community events. WIC staff completed extensive outreach throughout the region, connecting families with Adagio Health services, fresh produce through Farm Fresh partnerships, and on-site dental care for children. The breastfeeding helpline remained available seven days a week and supported families through 86 after-hours calls, while virtual breastfeeding classes and support groups reached more than 140 participants across all counties.

Through SNAP Education (SNAP-Ed), Adagio Health reached more than 87,000 participants at 426 locations, delivering 10,389 nutrition education sessions and more than 138,000 hands-on food exposures and tastings. Policy, systems, and environmental (PSE) efforts continued to focus on increasing access to healthy foods and physical activity, including nine interactive stencil art projects at schools and early childhood sites. Farm to School and Farm to Early Care and Education (ECE) initiatives expanded across 13 counties, engaging 25,792 K-12 students and 1,167 preschoolers in food exploration, gardening, and local agriculture. Adagio Health also welcomed visits from federal and state leaders and participated in national advocacy efforts to elevate the importance of SNAP-Ed programming.

Adagio Health's Education Programs continued to support youth, educators, and families across the region. Sexual health education reached students at two Young Scholars charter schools, while the Teen Outreach Program (TOP) partnered with 12 school districts and community organizations to engage more than 700 teens in service-learning, leadership development, and community-building activities. New programming, including the Healthy Relationships Toolkit, offered middle school students the skills to build healthy communication and conflict resolution habits. Additional initiatives included workplace drug and alcohol education for adults and Youth Mental Health First Aid training for professionals who work with children and teens.

Nutrition Operations had a year of significant growth and community impact. The Farm Fresh initiative returned for the 2025 growing season, partnering with 22 local farms across 12 counties and serving 4,392 customers through farmers markets, pop-up farm stands, and FMNP benefit assistance. The program continued to expand access for seniors and veterans through market vouchers and veteran stand down events across Western Pennsylvania. Teaching Kitchens provided hands-on cooking experiences for families, reaching 500 children and 103 pregnant or postpartum women. Food cupboards across Adagio Health sites completed 18,857 intakes, with nearly one-third screening positive for food insecurity.

Adagio Health's Diabetes Prevention Program (DPP) delivered eight new cohorts for adults across 24 counties, helping participants reduce their risk of developing Type 2 diabetes through lifestyle change and ongoing support. The organization also launched a Nutrition Counseling program, providing 137 individualized sessions with a Registered Dietitian through in-person and telehealth appointments.

Adagio Health remained committed to building the next generation of nutrition and public health professionals. In 2025, the organization partnered with seven academic institutions to host 39 students across 12 offices, offering hands-on experience in community nutrition, education, and healthcare programs.

## Disease Prevention

### Cancer Screening

Adagio Health continued to administer the Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program (BCCEDP) across 62 Pennsylvania counties, providing critical screenings, diagnostic services, and support to thousands of individuals. In the last 12 months, Adagio Health and its BCCEDP partners screened 6,569 patients, including 4,106 mammograms and 2,542 cervical cancer screenings – representing the highest number of screenings completed in a single year. An additional 1,105 patients enrolled in the Mammogram Voucher Program (MVP), which covers breast screening and diagnostic services.

Adagio Health also assisted 753 uninsured patients in obtaining health insurance and accessing treatment following a breast or cervical cancer diagnosis or pre-cancer detection. Beyond these efforts, 317 additional patients received cancer screenings, with a focused effort on increasing screening rates and expanding enrollment among underinsured populations.

One patient's story illustrates the life-changing impact of these programs. In early 2025, a 29-year-old woman who had discovered a breast lump in March 2024 enrolled in BCCEDP after delaying care due to concerns about the cost of a mammogram and diagnostic testing. Through the program, she received an ultrasound and biopsy, which resulted in a breast cancer diagnosis. Adagio Health then supported her in securing health insurance to cover surgery and chemotherapy, ensuring timely access to the treatment she needed.

## Tobacco Free Adagio Health

Adagio Health's Tobacco Prevention and Control program serves 24 counties across Western Pennsylvania, providing education, prevention, and cessation resources to communities throughout the region. In the Northwest, Southwest, and Allegheny County Health Districts, the team successfully:

- Expanded prevention and education efforts to 426 schools, reaching 30,666 students.
- Strengthened tobacco-free policies, with 111 worksite, multi-unit housing, and Young Lungs at Play policies passed.
- Ensured youth protections through 4,814 Act 112 compliance checks.
- Supported cessation and behavior change for 2,200 adults and teens, including 62 pregnant and postpartum mothers enrolled in the Healthy You, Healthy Baby program, which achieved a 69% retention and quit rate.
- Empowered student advocates, enrolling 2,639 students through the Pennsylvania Tobacco Resistance Unit (TRU) project.
- Introduced TRUBies, a new prevention program reaching over 300 elementary students in Western Pennsylvania.

Across the 24-county region, free services included prevention and education, cessation counseling, policy and enforcement support, and assistance to local healthcare providers and community-based organizations.

# Special Projects

## Rural Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome Prevention & Support

With support from the U.S. Health Resources and Services Administration, Adagio Health continued efforts to reduce Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome (NAS) in five rural Pennsylvania counties — Armstrong, Butler, Indiana, Lawrence, and Venango. The initiative expands behavioral health services, improves access to care for women of childbearing age with substance and opioid use disorders (SUD/OD), reduces stigma around addiction and NAS, and strengthens community partnerships.

Adagio Health leads Rural Communities C.A.R.E. (Consortium for Acceptance, Recovery, and Empowerment), a collaboration of nine organizations across Western Pennsylvania. Partners include Armstrong-Indiana-Clarion Drug and Alcohol Commission, Butler County Human Services Drug and Alcohol Programs, Carlow University, Lawrence County Community Action Program, Lawrence County Drug and Alcohol Commission, UPMC Insurance Services, UPMC Magee's Pregnancy and Women's Recovery Center in Franklin, and Venango County Human Services.

In the last 12 months, Adagio Health strengthened workforce capacity and cross-sector collaboration through the following efforts:

- Training Adagio Health WIC and Venango County Human Services staff in Mental Health First Aid
- Certifying Adagio Health Care Navigators as Community Health Workers
- Providing NAS and Parenting in Recovery training for Certified Peer Recovery Specialists in collaboration with Health Choices, and partnering with Mercer County Children & Youth to plan and host the annual NAS Symposium at Thiel College
- Certifying three Adagio Health Nurse Practitioners in Women's Care through Carlow University
- Educating Adagio Health medical staff about the Perinatal TIPS program, which provides psychiatric consultation for perinatal mental health needs
- Training the Integrated Care team in harm reduction and trauma-informed care

As a result, Adagio Health strengthened care for women and families affected by SUD/OD, expanded provider knowledge, and deepened community collaboration to address NAS across rural Western Pennsylvania.

### Empowering Veterans and Their Families

Adagio Health is committed to providing high-quality services to the veterans we serve. In 2025, the organization launched the Veterans Care Initiative (VCI), supporting women who have served or are currently serving in the military and reside in or receive services in Indiana, Venango, Lawrence, Butler, and Fayette counties. Funded by the Pennsylvania Department of Human Services, the VCI covers all out-of-pocket costs for services not paid by insurance or other assistance, including Adagio Health medical care, tobacco cessation counseling, cancer screenings, transportation support, behavioral health services, and nutrition counseling.

The initiative also advances Adagio Health's goal of improving data collection and analysis to ensure future program development is evidence-informed and effective. Since 2020, Adagio Health has been certified as a Veteran Ready Healthcare Organization by PsychArmor, a training center focused on military and veteran culture. All staff complete annual training to ensure program teams are prepared to address the unique needs of veterans.

### Veteran Initiative Highlights

- Presented at VetCon 2025 (Veterans in Economic Transition) at the request of the PA Department of Military and Veterans Affairs
- Partnered with Veteran Service Organizations and local farmers to deliver farm market and fresh vegetable distributions to 600 veterans across six counties
- Provided Mental Health First Aid training for veterans and military families to staff at veteran-serving organizations

Adagio Health continues to expand access, remove barriers to care, and provide meaningful support to the veteran community across Western Pennsylvania.

## Pennie Enrollment Program

In August, Adagio Health partnered with Pennie, Pennsylvania's official health insurance marketplace, and Health Market Connect to serve as a Pennie Regional Organization. Adagio Health now oversees Pennie outreach and enrollment support in a 10-county region: Allegheny, Armstrong, Beaver, Butler, Fayette, Greene, Indiana, Lawrence, Washington, and Westmoreland counties.

Pennie is the only place where Pennsylvanians can apply, shop, and enroll in health insurance from top carriers while qualifying for financial assistance to reduce monthly premiums and cost-sharing. The program focuses on educating residents about the value of health insurance, helping them understand their coverage options, and increasing the number of Pennsylvanians with quality health coverage.

From October to December, eight Adagio Health staff completed Pennie certification training and supported over 50 local outreach and enrollment events, providing hands-on assistance to help individuals access health insurance.



# Compliance

Adagio Health remains committed to strong compliance practices that support ethical operations, regulatory adherence, privacy oversight, and organizational accountability. We maintain compliance with applicable federal, state, and local regulations across healthcare delivery, public health programs, financial management, and employment practices, while regularly reviewing and updating internal policies to align with evolving requirements. Ongoing staff training, internal monitoring, and quality assurance activities reinforce a culture of transparency, responsibility, and continuous improvement. Executive leadership and Board oversight continue to provide essential governance and stewardship in support of Adagio Health's mission.

# Human Resources

Our Human Resources team continues to advance a strategic framework focused on recruitment, retention, and employee engagement. Enhanced HR systems support data-driven decision-making that strengthens hiring and retention efforts across the organization. Investment in leadership development, coaching, and workplace well-being remains a top priority, supporting a strong and resilient workforce.

# Information Technology

Throughout the year, Adagio Health continued its commitment to modernizing organizational infrastructure. This work included the successful migration of legacy systems to cloud-based and virtual platforms, improving scalability while reducing maintenance demands. The organization also deployed new enterprise-wide, cloud-based service portals to streamline ticket resolution and enhance workflow efficiency across departments.

In parallel, Adagio Health advanced ongoing improvements to its digital security posture and renewed its focus on physical site safety – ensuring both infrastructure and staff remain protected as the organization continues to evolve.

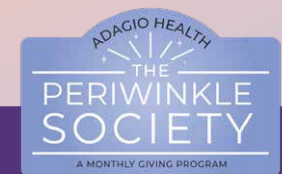

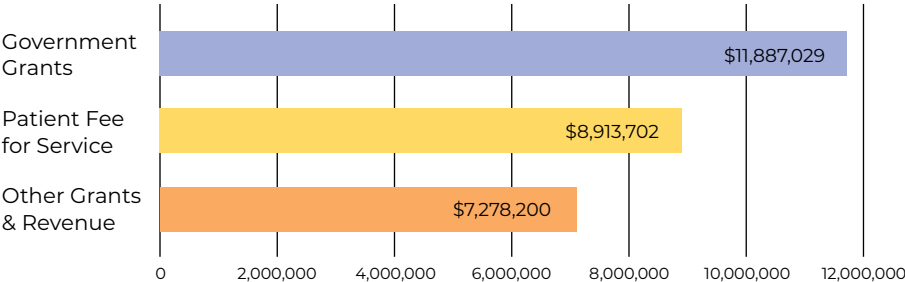

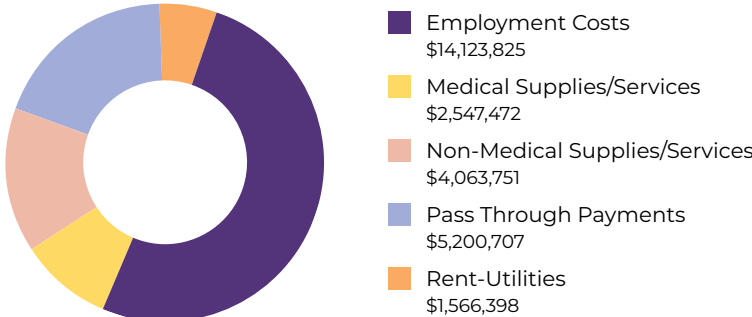

2025 Revenue \$28,078,931



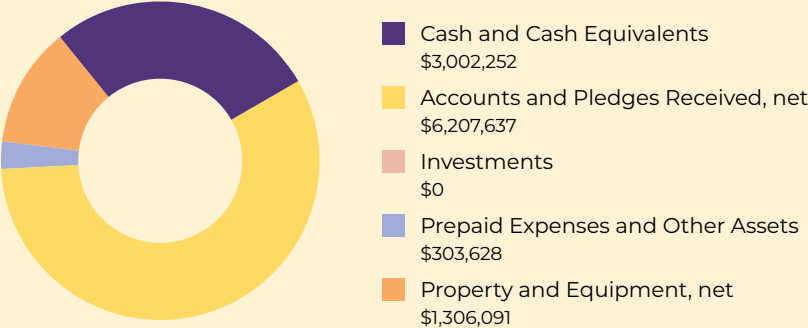
2025 Expenses \$27,502,153



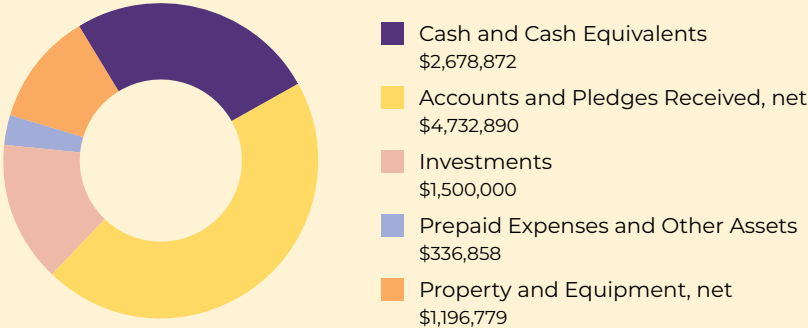
